

FEATURED FRIDAY

The Featured Friday series was started in January 2015 to provide programs of cultural, historical and local interest to library visitors. It has continued to include an eclectic variety of presenters and topics. Many of the guest speakers are college professors and several of them have connections to the Deer Park community. Past program subjects have included the Great Galveston Hurricane of 1900, the early Texas concerts of Elvis Presley and the first-hand experience of a WW2 survivor.

The Featured Friday programs will be included in the city-wide celebration of the 125th anniversary of the founding of Deer Park. The 2017 series kicked off on Friday, January 13 with Councilwoman Sherry Garrison’s discussion about the colorful life of Simeon West, the Yankee businessman, who founded Deer Park, Texas. CHILDREN'S CORNER

Storytime

Storytime programs incorporate books, finger plays, songs, & activities to promote interest in reading and lifelong learning. We currently offer three programs which are divided by recommended ages.

Infant Lapsit Storytime Wednesday @ 11:00 am

This program, recommended for 0-2 years, features songs, rhymes, socialization, bubbles, and board books. Caregivers are required to stay with the child and help them participate in the program.

Toddler Storytime Thursday @ 10:15 am

Recommended for children 2- 3½. Songs, activities, and stories encouraging a love for books and language, increase attention span and develop basic social skills. Caregivers are required to stay with the toddler and encourage participation in the program.

Preschool Storytime Thursday @ 11:00 am

Recommended for children 3 ½ - 6. Children listen to stories, and participate in group activities during the 30-40 minute sessions. A craft often enhances the story theme.

A special Egg Hunt Storytime will be held on April 13, at 10:15 am. We will have a Spring themed story-time with a special egg hunt inside the library to follow!

Did you know that the Deer Park Public Library has great electronic resources for children? The Youth Services page of our website offers materials for children with wonderful options for homework help and fun and games. Everything is accessible from inside the library and also from home with your library card!

Homework Help offers links to resources such as

- Primary Search- designed for elementary school aged
- Middle Search Plus- designed for middle school aged
- Explora- designed for multiple ages; providing searching by popular topic and by keyword and delivers results as articles, essays, images and more.

Books & Games provides links to

- Pebble Go- databases on popular subjects for younger learners with leveled text. Audio/video media makes this interactive database more fun!
- Capstone Interactive Library- Interactive eBooks featuring text highlighting and read-to-me audio for readers of all types and ages
- Tumblebooks—eBooks for eKids! These animated picture books help our little one learn to love reading through adding animation, sound, music, and narration.

She is a speaker on space topics, a technical editor, science fiction writer, and book reviewer. She is best known for her award-winning children's books about space, including the NSTA 2016 Outstanding Trade Book *Welcome to Mars* which she coauthored with Apollo 11's Buzz Aldrin for National Geographic. Ms. Dyson will be speaking about her NASA experience and the humorous and serious aspects of working the shuttle program.
